- 1. To begin a new year on September 16 our program was the introduction of our six (6) branch scholarship recipients—Katt, Aja, Riley, Zabiba, Caroline, and Reese. Also introduction of an AAUW National International Fellowship recipient—Heidi. Each recipient shared their goals and their current studies.
- 2. On January 20 Karen Estlund, Dean of CSU Libraries presented how these new technologies of artificial intelligence are being used to customize experiences, increase inclusivity and access, and provide massive batch processing. Questions of ethics, bias, and how tools are designed and used lead to discussions.
- 3. On April 11 AAUW of Colorado was represented by Fort Collins Branch members Autumn Matsutani and Heidi Tseng as volunteer judges at the Colorado Science and Engineering Fair at Colorado State University. AAUW of Colorado awards of \$250 each were given in the Junior Division to Samantha Goetz, 7th Grader at St. Peter's Catholic School, Monument and Senior Division to Amy Zhang, 9th Grader at Lakewood High School, Lakewood.
- 4. Our year ended with a program Pronouns on May 18. Members were able to share and discuss providing space and opportunity for people to share their pronouns does not mean that everyone feels comfortable or needs to share their pronouns.
- 5. Sending branch newsletters/emails with info to students, prospective members to attend in person branch meetings/webinars at the state and national level, August, 2023 to May, 2024.
- 6. Also registering for Virtual Fall Leadership Conference August 19, 2023 and Virtual Public Policy Day on February 3, 2024.
